
Mathematics

By the end of the term, the children should have a better understanding of measurement, measuring weight, distance and time. Home School Reminders



Nursery **Mulberry Class**


Communication and Language and Literacy

Understanding the World

This term our class topics are 'Amazing Adventures!' and 'Weather and Seasons.
