School attendance

No holidays during term time will be authorised. If you take your child on holiday during term time, both parents are at risk of being issued with a penalty notice. If your child has 5 days (equating to 10 sessions of unauthorised absences) in one term, or 10 lates after 9.30am in a term, you will be issued with a penalty notice. If leave of absence for exceptional circumstances is required, please complete the form which is available from the school office. The Head teacher will consider whether or not this is authorised, on behalf of the Governing Board. Medical appointments including dental, optician and non-emergency GP appointments need to be taken out of school hours, if possible. Urgent GP appointments will require confirmation from the medical practitioner.

Free School Meals

All children in Reception class, Year 1 or Year 2 get free school meals, regardless of parents' income. We would encourage all children to try our tasty and healthy school lunches, which are well nutritionally balanced and include fresh fruit, crunchy vegetables, salad, dairy (milk, yoghurt, cheese), protein (meat, eggs, pulses) and starchy food (wholemeal bread, pasta, potatoes), which are essential for a healthy diet and your child's development.

However, even if your child is in one of these year groups, we still need you to apply for free meals each school year, if you're receiving benefits. This will allow school to claim important extra funding that will benefit your child and s/he can be offered subsidised trip places and Playcentre places at a cheaper rate. School gets extra funding, known as the "pupil premium" for every child registered as eligible for Free



School Meals and we can use this money for booster classes, educational trips and new afterschool clubs.

Parents of children attending nursey and classes 3 to 6 will have to pay for their meals, unless they're receiving benefits. Please speak to the office staff if you need help with the online application for Free School Meals or to check if you are eligible.
