Well done Rowan and Arbutus classes! Overall the whole school percentage is currently at 89.7% for these first few weeks. Will a different class beat Arbutus next week?


Curriculum News—Early Years Foundation Stage

Reception Aspen Class

In Aspen Class, we have been reading the story of "Whatever Next" by Jill Murphy. We have learnt to predict what might happen in the story, sequence the events, and create a story map. We have also discussed how a list will help us when organizing a party on the Moon. We then created our own list and shared with our friends.

In Maths, we revised measuring mass and capacity. We used non-standard units such as cubes to measure the mass of objects and the capacity of containers. We have also learnt to identify and represent numbers 6, 7 and 8.

Our topic is Space for this term. We imagined looking through the Hubble telescope and explored the different types of galaxies. Did you know there are three types of galaxies- elliptical, spiral and irregular? We have then painted our own galaxies as a creative response.
