Mathematics

Measurement

We are learning how to compare and measure length/ height, weight/ mass.

Place Value

This term we will be focusing on number order and patterns to 100. The children will say which numbers are greater or smaller by comparing the tens and ones in a 2 digit number.

Addition and Subtraction

We will keep practising different strategies to gain fluency adding and subtracting 1 and 2 digit numbers.

Multiplication and Division

The children will be introduced to the concept of multiplication as counting in steps of 2s,5s and 10s as well as 'groups of.' Then, the children will look at division as sharing. They will begin to solve one step problems involving multiplication and division, by calculating the answer using concrete objects, pictorial representations and arrays with the support of the teacher.

Fractions

Children will read fractional notation and find halves and quarters of shapes and quantities.

Money

We will continue to recognise coins up to £1 and find different ways of making an amount.

Time

Children will sequence events, as well as practise telling the time to the hour and half hour.

<u>English</u>

Our author focus this term will be Alexis Deacon.

Fantasy:


We will read some of Deacon's stories meeting the adorable alien Beegu and exploring her feelings about being on Earth. We will then read Croc and Bird and discover what these unlikely friends get up to.

Retell:

The children will use story maps and picture prompts to help them retell stories. They will be taught that a story has a beginning, a middle and an end. We will continue to consolidate the use of capital letters, finger spaces and full stops as well as the use of adjectives and interesting openers.


Reading:

Year 1

Magnolia and Juniper

RE & PHSE

Our PSHE topic this term are Britain and Money Matters.

We will discuss which groups we belong to, explain how to be a good neighbor and discuss things that may help or harm a neighbourhood. We will describe what it is like to live in Britain, identify similarities and differences between British people and learn why it is important to have differences.

In Money Matters we will discuss the difference between things we want and things we need. Identify ways to keep money and our belongings safe and discuss different sources that money can come from.

In **RE** we will be learning about Hinduism in the first half term and Judaism in the second half term. We will discuss beliefs and important festivals for each religion.

Physical Education
