Numeracy

Fractions: This term we will start by finding fractions of shapes and progress on to fractions of amounts e.g. 1/4 of 16 and 1/2 of 20.

Measurement: The children will learn about time; how to tell the time to the nearest 5 and 15 minutes and they will learn how to measure mass, length, capacity, height and temperature.

Money: We will be learning about coins and notes. The children will learn about how to count money in pounds and pence. They will also learn how to select and choose money to make an amount.

Properties of shapes: The children will be learning about 2D and 3D shapes as well as looking at the properties of the shapes such as how many sides, edges, faces, vertices and identifying how many lines of symmetries the shapes have.





Literacy

Reading: In addition to Phonics and Reading in class, we encourage you to support your child by reading with your child for fifteen minutes a day and record this in their reading record.

Our author focus is *Anthony Browne*. We will be reading, discussing and researching books by this author. We will also be infusing some of his work into our Literacy lessons.

Writing Focus: This term, we will be learning how to structure and write different types of texts such as traditional poems, instructions and explanation texts. Children will consolidate how to write in either present or past tense and how to extend their sentences with adjectives, conjunctions, interesting sentence openers and expanded noun phrases.

SPaG (Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar): We will revisit verbs, nouns, expanded noun phrases, homophones, adding suffixes to root words and contractions.

PHSE

Children will learn about the rights every individual has and learn to understand the importance of respecting these rights. We will discuss the concept of differences and the importance of fairness. We will encourage the children to reflect on how they should behave towards people who are different from themselves.

RE - What does it mean for a Christian belong to a Church?

The children will explore how baptism and infant dedication express the hope that children will grow up to follow the teaching and example of Jesus; They will think about how belonging to the Christian 'family' means living in the way Jesus taught. We will discuss how local leaders of Christian communities (e.g. priests, ministers, elders) teach about Jesus and belonging to the Christian family. They will then find out about how the symbols of

baptism (eg water, light, the sign of the cross and the colour of baptism clothing) mark a new beginning in the Christian family.



Year 2 Curriculum Information Summer

SCIENCE

This term we will be studying:

Animals Including Humans: The children will compare the different stages of growth in humans. They will also consider the importance of being healthy and how people can maintain a healthy lifestyle through their diet and exercise.

Plants: The children will sow and observe how a seed or bulb becomes a plant. They will observe a range of seeds and what these seeds grow into. They will carry out short tests to observe seeds over time and learn how to record their findings.



BCC

This term we will be learning about the lives of specific historical and modern women. We will study the history of their lives and how their impact lives on today.



<u>PE</u>

This term our P.E. unit will be ball games as well as learning different skills such as throwing and catching.

Rowan class will have PE on Mondays and Fridays.

The children **need** to bring in PE clothing. This consists of: a white t shirt, black shorts or jogging bottoms and black trainers or plimsolls. Their PE clothing can be left on their peg and collected at the end of the week.
