## Curriculum News

**Reception Pine** have been reading 'Oh No, George' by Chris Haughton and are learning how to retell it using Makaton signs and actions. We have also enjoyed related art activities.



Year 5 Birch have been looking at the work of Clara Ledesma, a Dominican-born American artist best known for her paintings in the post World War II era. We enjoyed blending and layering colours together, drawing in the style of the artist. We used our drawing tools with control and dexterity to recreate Ledesma's signature drawings.

Until...

at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
48 hours after their last episode
