					each year group made at least 1 terms progress. 9 pupils across years 5 & 6 took part in Hackney Pirates. Pupils had 58 sessions. This consisted of small group work and 1 to 1 sessions. 8 out of 9 of the pupils demonstrated over 90% attendance. All pupils have made significant progress in reading with half of pupils working at age expected and all pupils making at least a year's progress. The project has improved their love of reading and comprehension skills. All pupils have improved creativity in writing with all pupils making at least a year's progress in relation to their starting points.
