## Message from Ms Drew

Welcome back to the summer term. I hope you all had a restful Easter. This is a very strange way to start the term I missing seeing you all, but of course we have to do this to keep the school community safe.

Everyone at Benthal has been busy even with the school closed. We had a play scheme here over the Easter holiday as Benthal was used as a hub school for the whole of the



borough. It was open to key worker children and was very successful. Many of the children and the grownups had never been to Benthal and were very impressed with our school, especially our outdoor space. They loved the outdoor gym too, they thought it was amazing and the children of Benthal 'were really lucky to have it'.

Staff have been on a duty rota since the school closure in order to keep the school open for our key worker children and other children who are eligible. The children have been completing their home learning packs in school and I've seen lots of them do the daily Joe Wicks workout too. We have got very clear social distancing guidance in place in the classrooms, in corridors, out in the playground, even in the lunch hall!

I've been busy organising, collecting (in my car) and then handing out weekly food hampers to lots of our children and their families, including over the Easter holiday. Lots of members of staff have helped me with this too. I know the govemment have issued vouchers for families to use, if you think you may qualify for the voucher scheme as your circumstances have changed recently then please ensure you speak to the school office.

A very BIG announcement; class emails will be launched soon! The teachers in Year 2 and in the juniors will soon have a class email to begin using. The teachers will be able to send you online learning links; upload activities and send attachments of work to you and your families and you will be able to email back if you need any help with a task. Teachers will be using parent/carer emails to send 3 weeks' worth of home learning tasks including a new timetable. They will continue to communicate with you through Marvellous Me twice a day, to let you know which activities the children need to do. We have written a Parent/Carer guide in how teachers will use the class emails at Benthal. This will be emailed to you, so look out for it very soon. Please inform the office if you have changed your email address recently.

The children and their families in Year I, Reception and Nursery will continue to communicate with their class teacher through Tapestry. We have also written a Parent/Carer guide in how teachers will be using Tapestry moving forward.

In addition, we have sent out a text to find out if you have a PC or laptop at home, including internet access. If you do not, then please contact the school office to let us know. We are trying to source extra laptops to ensure that everyone has access to online learning. In the meantime teachers are preparing new updated home learning packs to be collected, we will let you know when.

I have really enjoyed looking at Benthal's Twitter account and seeing all the photographs of your home learning projects that you have posted. Keep it up, it is fantastic to see. You are really 'creating irresistible learning!'

Finally, the end of April and the start of May is when the Benthal swifts arrive! These tiny birds have flown all the way from South Africa to fly above our school. They only stay for a few months before flying back to South Africa, so it's important that we look out for them. Keep looking in the sky for a black curved shape and a high pitched twitter. They fly very high in the sky so it is difficult to see them, you will probably hear them first. Take care when looking into the sky though; you don't want to look directly into the sun accidentally.

Let me know when you see or hear them, I love the fact that they come back to Benthal each year. I wonder if they know that they are on our jumpers as our school logo!

Perhaps you could draw or paint a picture of them flying above the school, and post a photograph of it on our Twitter account.

- Class Reading Books—We are offering you the opportunity to come and swap your reading books every other week. We are following government safety guidelines by disinfecting every book returned. We need to ensure the virus is not taken home on a book, this is the common sense approach.
- Free milk for all under-fives (Nursery and Reception children) will be provided from week beginning 4th May every Friday. Please collect it from the main reception office waiting area 10-12 noon. Please note that Friday 8th of May is a bank holiday so collection for this week only will be on Thursday 7th May and weekly on Fridays thereafter.
