Free School Meals Updates

- To qualify for Free School Meals, you must be a Hackney resident and get one of the benefits below: income support, JSA, child tax credit/working tax credit and getting no more than £16190 a year, pension credit, income-related employment and support allowance or universal credit with a net earnings threshold of £15,400 a year. Please apply online using the link below if you think your child could be entitled https://education.hackney.gov.uk/content/applyfree-school-meals
- If your child is entitled to means-tested free school meals, you will receive a supermarket voucher to cover May halfterm. Please ensure the school has your up-to-date email address.
- School uniform grant at age of 11: your child can get a school uniform grant if they are transferring from primary (Year 6) to secondary school (Year 7). Apply once you have accepted the secondary school transfer offer from Hackney Education. Eligible applicants can expect to receive their grant prior to the start of term if they apply before 30 June.
