Year 5

Year 5 kicked off Autumn term with an exciting Science lesson dissecting real flowers. The children identified the key parts and explored the life cycles of a flower, using scientific vocabulary to support their understanding.

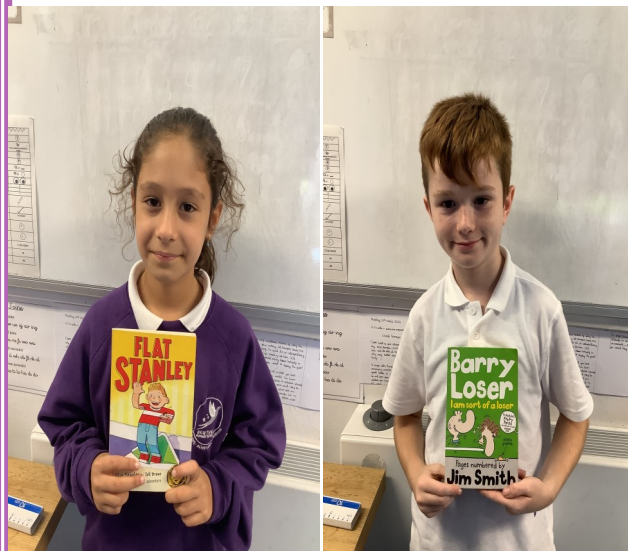
During our Destination Reader sessions, the class have been developing their clarifying and inferring skills through rich discussions. They've also been sharing the books they're reading at home, showing great enthusiasm in their journey to become Champion Readers!

In Literacy, we've been bringing stories to life through gestures and memorization. The students have been fully immersed in learning and performing the model texts, helping them build confidence and deepen their understanding of the structure and language associated with the different topics.

Finally, our most recent Science topic explored the properties of materials. The children made predictions and tested whether materials were magnetic, transparent or solid - using key vocabulary to explain their scientific explorations.

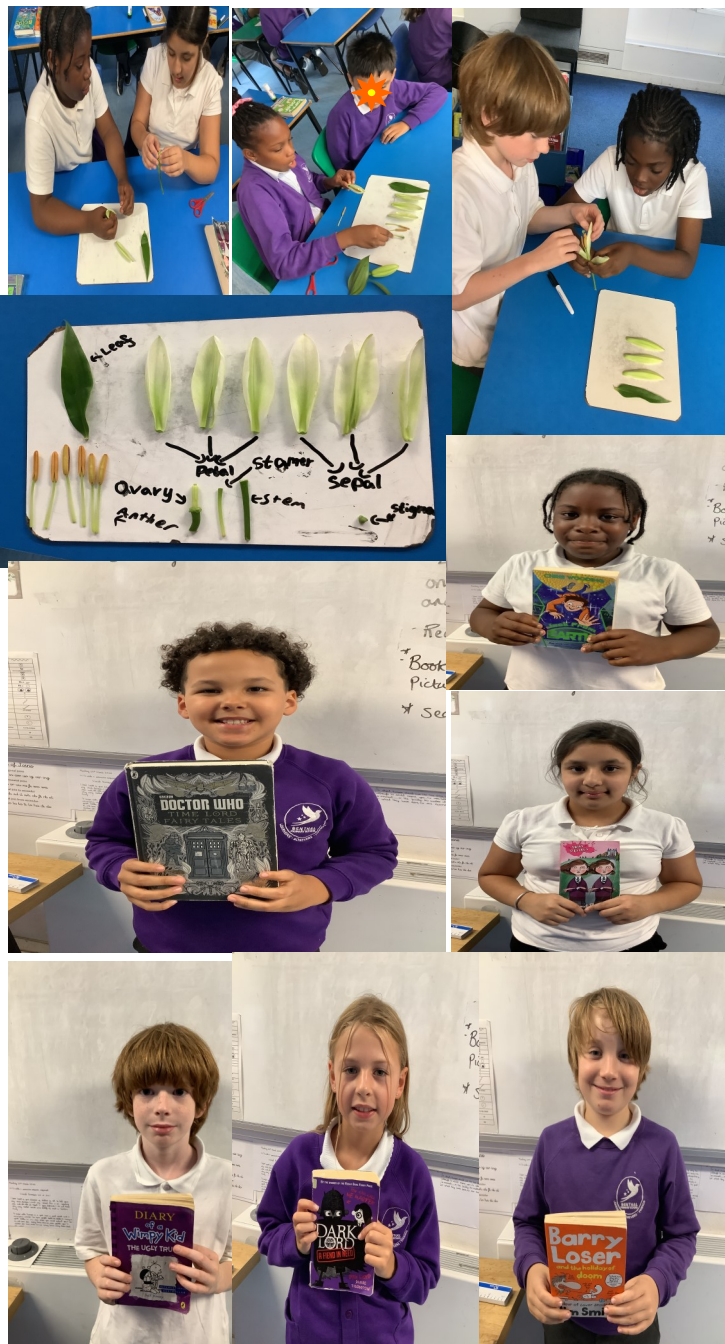
It's been a brilliant and busy Autumn term.
